Xavier University, Patna successfully hosted a National Seminar on ***“Building Resilient Commerce in a VUCA World”*** on 21 November 2025.

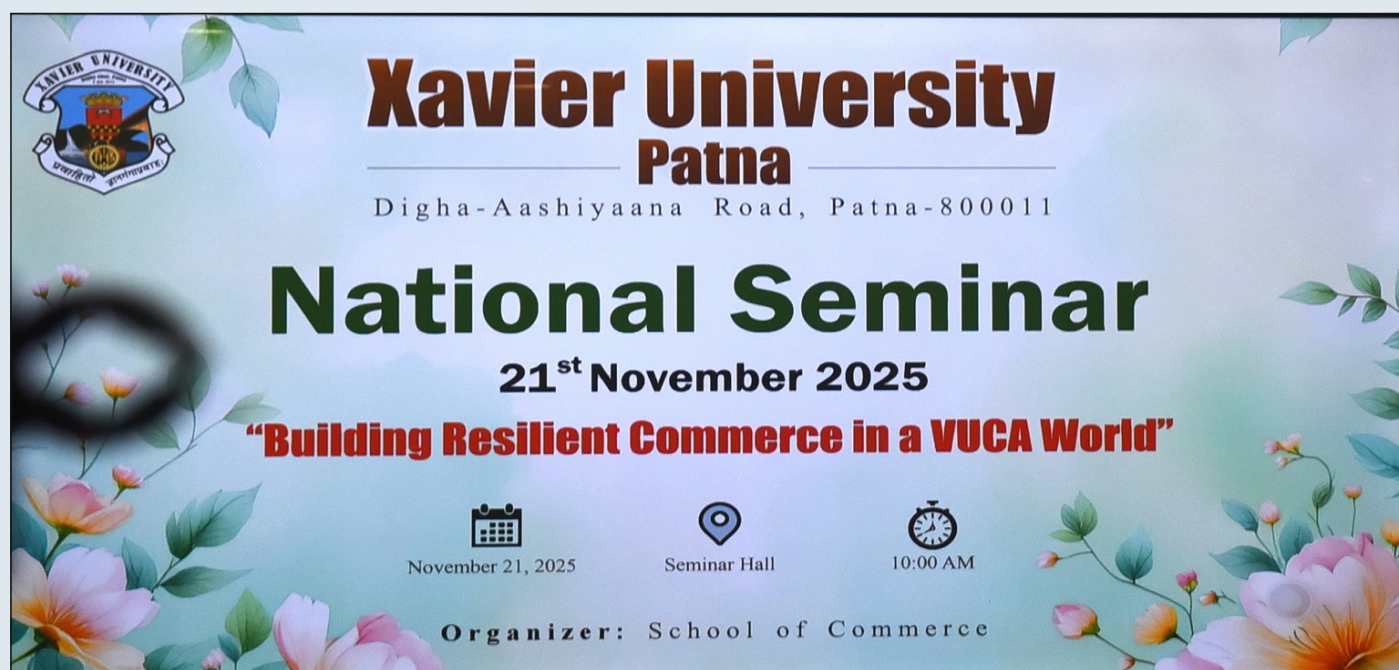
Organized by the Department of Commerce, the event brought together esteemed academicians, researchers, and industry professionals from across the country.

A Discourse on Democracy: Scrutinizing the Constitutional Promise and Judicial Guardianship

On a recent Saturday morning, the prestigious DAV BSEB auditorium transformed into a vibrant forum for constitutional discourse. I was honoured to be invited as a guest speaker to address an august gathering comprising distinguished city academicians, esteemed legal luminaries, and keen senior students on two profound themes central to our republic: *“Has the Indian Constitution fulfilled its promise?”* and *“The role of the judiciary in safeguarding constitutional values.”*

The first address engaged critically with the Constitution's journey since 1950. While celebrating its unparalleled success in establishing a stable, pluralistic democracy and a framework of fundamental rights, the narrative acknowledged it as a dynamic project rather than a completed task. The discussion highlighted the Preamble's promise of justice—social, economic, and political—as an ongoing national endeavour. Landmark achievements were weighed against persistent challenges in achieving substantive equality and universal dignity, concluding that the Constitution provides not just a promise, but the tools for its continual fulfilment.

This analysis laid the groundwork for the second lecture, which positioned the judiciary as the primary instrument wielding those tools. The talk

elucidated the Supreme Court and High Courts' critical role as sentinels through judicial review. Landmark interventions, from establishing the 'Basic Structure' doctrine to pioneering Public Interest Litigation (PIL), were cited as testament to an activist judiciary expanding the frontiers of rights, particularly through a transformative reading of Article 21. The address affirmed that an independent judiciary remains the vital bulwark protecting the constitutional conscience from erosion.

The intellectually charged atmosphere reached its peak during the extensive question-and-answer session. The queries from legal experts and scholars were incisive, probing deeper into judicial activism's limits, contemporary challenges to constitutional morality, and the role of citizenry. This interaction underscored the event's success in fostering meaningful dialogue beyond a monologue.

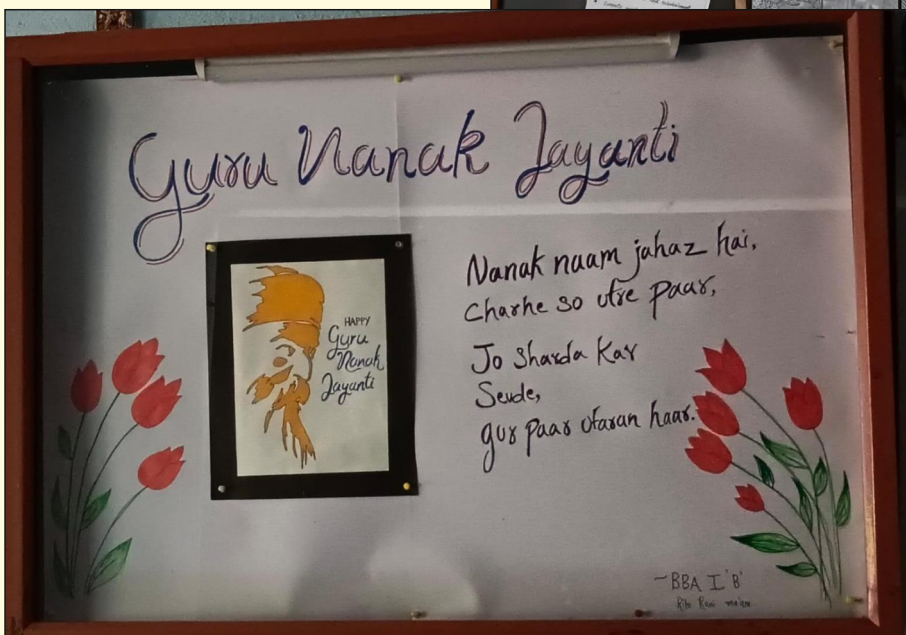
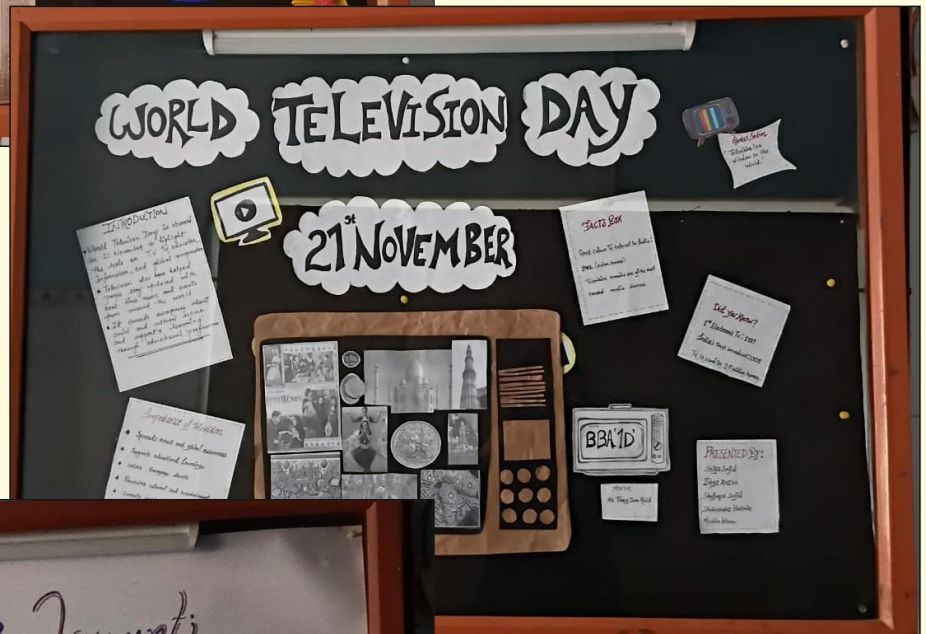
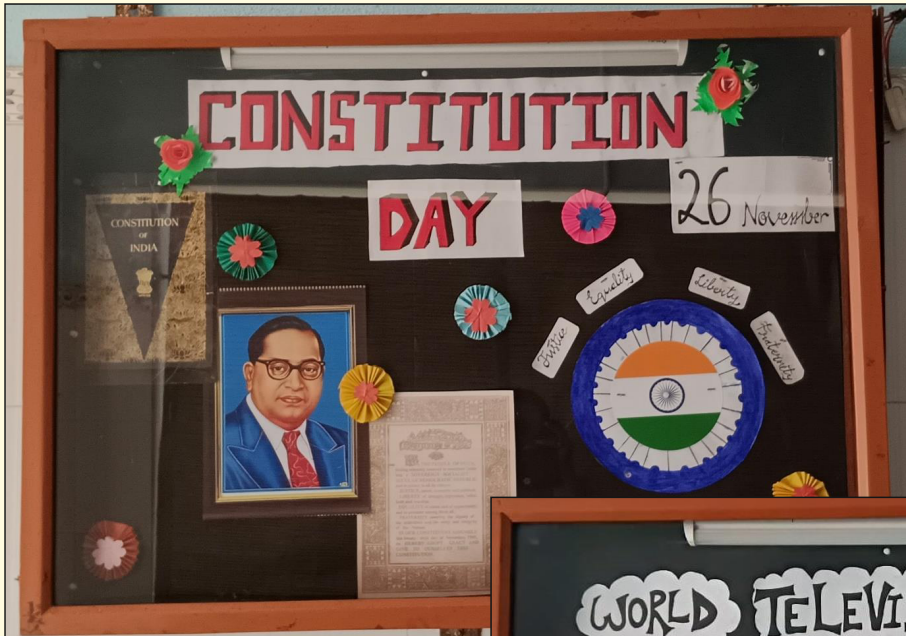

truly matters to us, mainly, our relationships, compassion, and the joy of giving.

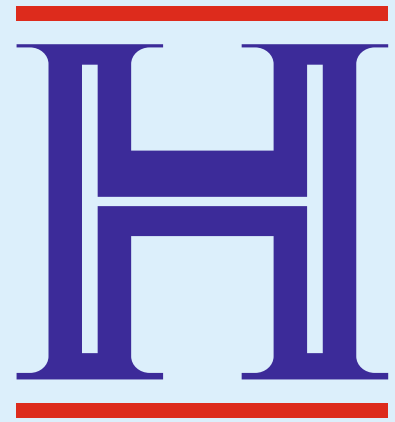

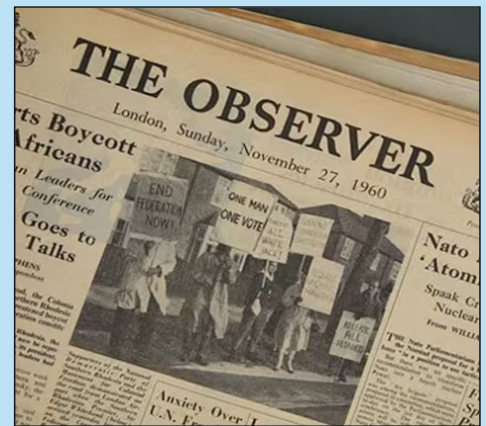
